Agenda

- I. Nutrition: Food Services : DeAnn Lee prepared a report which was presented by Mrs. Robbins on the number of meals served during the month of December. School Breakfast program fed 3,115. School Lunch Program fed 1,853. There were 550 breakfast and 99 adult lunches. (61 adult meals, 38 adult worker meals) Adult meals include teachers and parents. Adult workers are the workers who prepare meals.
- II. Mrs. Riddle gave the counseling update. She spoke about:
 - A. Academic Advising Counselors January 22nd
 - B. Mental Health Monday with West Texas Guidance and Counseling
 - C. New Small Guidance Groups Self-Regulation
 - Additionally, it was mentioned that during the week, Mrs. Riddle was able to help 2 students get connected with TCHAT. (Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine) is a statewide program, involving Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center (TTUHSC), that provides free school-based mental health services (teletherapy/telepsychiatry) for PreK-12 students, connecting them with providers via video for easy access, with no cost to schools or families, to support early identification and treatment of mental health needs. Texas Tech plays a key role in delivering these telehealth services across many districts, leveraging the Texas Child Mental Health Care Consortium (TCMHCC) to improve student well-being.
- III. Mrs. Robbins gave an update on safety and security.
 - A. She spoke about books for consideration to be added to the school library and showed the members of the committee that there is a link on the library resources page. If a book is up for consideration, it must be posted on the website for at least 30 days. Then, the book will be approved or disapproved by the school board.

- B. The Emergency Operating Procedure manual was updated and approved by the school board in December.
- C. Mrs. Robbins also explained how the District uses Sentinel School Safety System
 - 1. Intruder Detection Audits,
 - 2. Behavioral Threat Assessments,
 - 3. District Vulnerability Assessments, and
 - 4. Emergency Management
