- I. Nutrition: Food Services  
We are currently trying out new breakfast items for next year: sausage biscuits, breakfast pizza, and raspberry PB & J.
- II. Counseling Programs Updates
  - A. Texas Child Health Access Through Telemedicine, or TCHATT is not being used currently due to no requests or referrals but is always available.
  - B. Major Clarity is utilized weekly, (mostly on Wednesdays.) / Student Interest Surveys within the program have been completed. This is important for our CCMR accountability
  - C. Health Career Exploration with Shannon Medical this fall
    1. 11th-12th graders interested in Health Sciences toured ASU facilities in February
  - D. Career Fair (Concho Valley Spark) at the Coliseum on February 26 for all Juniors and Seniors
  - E. ASU representative led Dual Credit Meeting for 10th & 11th graders in March
  - F. Our long time counselor Daisy Sanchez is retiring. Jessica Riddle has been hired to take her place.
- III. Health and Wellbeing
  - A. Social Emotional Learning - We use Second Step with Pre-K -2nd grade. Character Strong is incorporated into lessons and activities in grades 3-12; and Breathe for Change with Mrs. Bilyeu is also incorporated into the elementary grades
  - B. Seat Belt Awareness program with all 7th -12th graders
- IV. New Business
  - A. Texas Traffic Safety Program: Allie's Way was discussed and agreed upon as another activity to bring to our campus next year.
  - B. We were contacted by a representative from South Plains Community Action Association (a non-profit) out of Abilene that helps families obtain health insurance. I will copy the informational handouts and post on our social media.
